SUBJECT: RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE MODIFICATION AND EXPANSION OF THE CITY'S COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA (CRA)

This resolution supports the expansion and modification of terms and tax exemptions of the original Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area CRA.

History: Beachwood City Council pursuant to Ordinance No. 2018-36, established the original Community Reinvestment Area for commercial and residential properties within Commerce Park and Chagrin Boulevard to Richmond Road. Then later, through Ordinance No. 2020-113, amended that CRA to include all commercial parcels within the City of Beachwood. Both of these CRA areas are defined by *Exhibit A*. At that time, City Council also authorized legislation to enter into a School Compensation Agreement supporting shared revenue with the Board of Education, Ordinance 2020-114.

Project Details: This new legislation modifies and expands the existing CRA district to support continued commercial and industrial investment within The Chagrin Highlands property and the City Beachwood. An expanded CRA is necessary to stimulate property appreciation, support incremental increases in property value within key sites, and reposition The Chagrin Highlands and the City as a more competitive option for both regional and national site selection decisions. It provides an impactful tool within our Economic Development toolkit which may be strategically used to move projects from conception into construction within underutilized, blighted and challenged redevelopment sites, positioning key areas for greater growth in property value and the creation of new job growth. This expanded CRA will support greater growth overall in our tax-base long-term.

Modifications: The legislation supports the expansion of the terms of the CRA, increasing from a 50% exemption to a 75% exemption, as allowed for municipalities by Ohio Revised Code section 3735.671 and amended by HB 33, effective April 2023. Our existing School Compensation Agreement set by Ordinance of City Council remains in effect, under which the City shares 50/50 with Board of Education payroll taxes for new employees in the defined CRA area by legislation for an aggregate exceeding \$1,500,000 of new employee payroll and limited to the loss of property taxes to the Board of Education. An additional change within the legislation removes the CRA for new residential construction.

Recommendations: My recommendation is to proceed with this legislation approving the expansion and modification for the purposes of Economic Development, fostering growth in our tax base long-term, new job creation, business attraction/expansion and supporting commercial growth within key site opportunities. The recommendation is further supported as it meets the objectives of the Commerce Park Revitalization Study, the City's Economic Development Action Plan and action items defined for Economic Development within the City's Master Plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-16

AN ORDINANCE EXPANDING AND MODIFYING THE TERMS AND TAX EXEMPTIONS OF THE COMMERCE PARK COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA; AND DECLARING THIS TO BE AN URGENT MEASURE

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, by the enactment of Ohio Revised Code Sections 3735.65 et seq. (the “Community Reinvestment Area Program”), has heretofore authorized municipal corporations to designate Community Reinvestment Areas within the State in order to provide incentives for new residential, commercial or industrial development and/or rehabilitation in such areas, by making available property tax exemption for such new development or rehabilitation;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Community Reinvestment Area Program, this Council, on January 23, 2018 passed its Ordinance No. 2018-36 (the “Original CRA Ordinance”), in which it approved the designation of the geographic area described in the Original CRA Ordinance and found that the construction of new structures in areas located within the City, as described and depicted in the Original CRA Ordinance and known as the Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area would serve to encourage economic stability, maintain real property values, and generate new employment opportunities within the Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area and the City of Beachwood as a whole;

WHEREAS, this Council, on October 20, 2020 passed its Ordinance No. 2020-113 (the “Amendment”, and together with the Original CRA Ordinance, the “CRA Ordinance”), amending the Original CRA Ordinance to allow for the addition of parcels;

WHEREAS, the City has performed an updated housing study (the “Housing Study”) for the Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area;

WHEREAS, due to market conditions, the parcels comprising the Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area continue to lack investment in new residential housing, housing repairs and new commercial investment in older underutilized residential and commercial buildings;

WHEREAS, this Council now desires to amend the Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area and expand it in order to grant tax abatements to encourage economic stability, maintain real property values and generate new employment opportunities;

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Beachwood also desires to modify the tax exemption, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Sections 3735.65 to 3735.70;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Beachwood, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: Pursuant to ORC Section 3735.66, the Commerce Park Community Reinvestment Area and the CRA Ordinance is hereby amended to include the expanded area described and depicted in Exhibit “A”, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein. Only residential, commercial and/or industrial properties consistent with the applicable zoning regulations within the designated Expanded Community Reinvestment Area will be eligible for exemptions under this Program.

Section 2: All properties identified in Exhibit “A” as being within the designated Expanded Community Reinvestment Area are eligible for this incentive. This proposal is a public/private

partnership intended to promote and expand conforming uses in the designated area. As part of the project, the City of Beachwood intends to undertake supporting public improvements in the designated area.

Section 3: Section 4 of the CRA Ordinance shall be amended and restated to read as follows:

Within the Community Reinvestment Area, the percentage of the tax exemption on the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from improvements to commercial and industrial real property and the term of those exemptions shall be negotiated on a case-by-case basis in advance of construction or remodeling occurring according to the rules outlined in the ORC Section 3735.67. The results of the negotiation as approved by this Council will be set forth in writing in a Community Reinvestment Area Agreement as outlined in ORC Section 3735.671.

For residential property, a tax exemption on the increase in the assessed valuation resulting from the improvements as described in ORC Section 3735.67 shall be granted upon application by the property owner and certification thereof by the designated Housing Officer for the following periods:

- a. Ten (10) years for the remodeling of every residential dwelling unit containing not more than two (2) housing units with a minimum investment of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$25,000.00), and with such exemption being ~~fifty twenty-five~~ percent (~~2550~~%) for each of the ten (10) years.
- b. Up to, and including, fifteen (15) years, and up to, and including, seventy five percent (75%) for the remodeling of existing commercial and industrial facilities, with a minimum investment of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$250,000.00) for commercial and Five Hundred Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$500,000.00) for industrial with the term and percentage of which shall be negotiated on a case-by-case basis in advance of remodeling occurring.
- c. Up to, and including, fifteen (15) years, and up to, and including seventy five percent (75%) for the construction of new commercial or industrial facilities, the term and percentage of which shall be negotiated on a case-by-case basis in advance of construction occurring.

Upon expiration of any incentive described in this Section, parcels receiving such incentive will be subject to property taxation calculated on the assessed value of all land and improvements on that parcel.

Section 4: Section 6 of the CRA Ordinance shall be amended to read as follows:

To administer and implement the provisions of this Ordinance, the City of Beachwood, Economic Development Director is designated as the Housing Officer as described in Sections 3735.65 through 3735.70.

Section 5: Section 7 of the CRA Ordinance shall be amended to read as follows:

A Tax Incentive Review Council has been established pursuant to ORC Section 5709.85 to review annually the compliance of all agreements involving the granting of exemptions for commercial or industrial real property improvements under Section 3735.671, of the ORC and make written recommendations to the Council as to continuing, modifying or terminating said agreement based upon the performance of the agreement.

Section 6: Except as amended hereby, the CRA Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 7: This Council further hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor, the Clerk of Council, the Law Director, the Auditor, the Housing Officer, or other appropriate officers of the City to prepare and sign all agreements and instruments, to publish or deliver all required notices, submit all required petitions, and take any other actions as may be appropriate to implement this Ordinance. All previous actions taken by such officers are hereby ratified.

Section 8: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or its committees, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law including ORC Section 121.22.

Section 9: This Ordinance is declared to be an urgent measure necessary for the public peace, health, safety, or the efficient operation of the City; and for the further reason that this Ordinance must be enacted for the benefit of economic development and to alleviate the severe housing shortage the City is currently experiencing; wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.

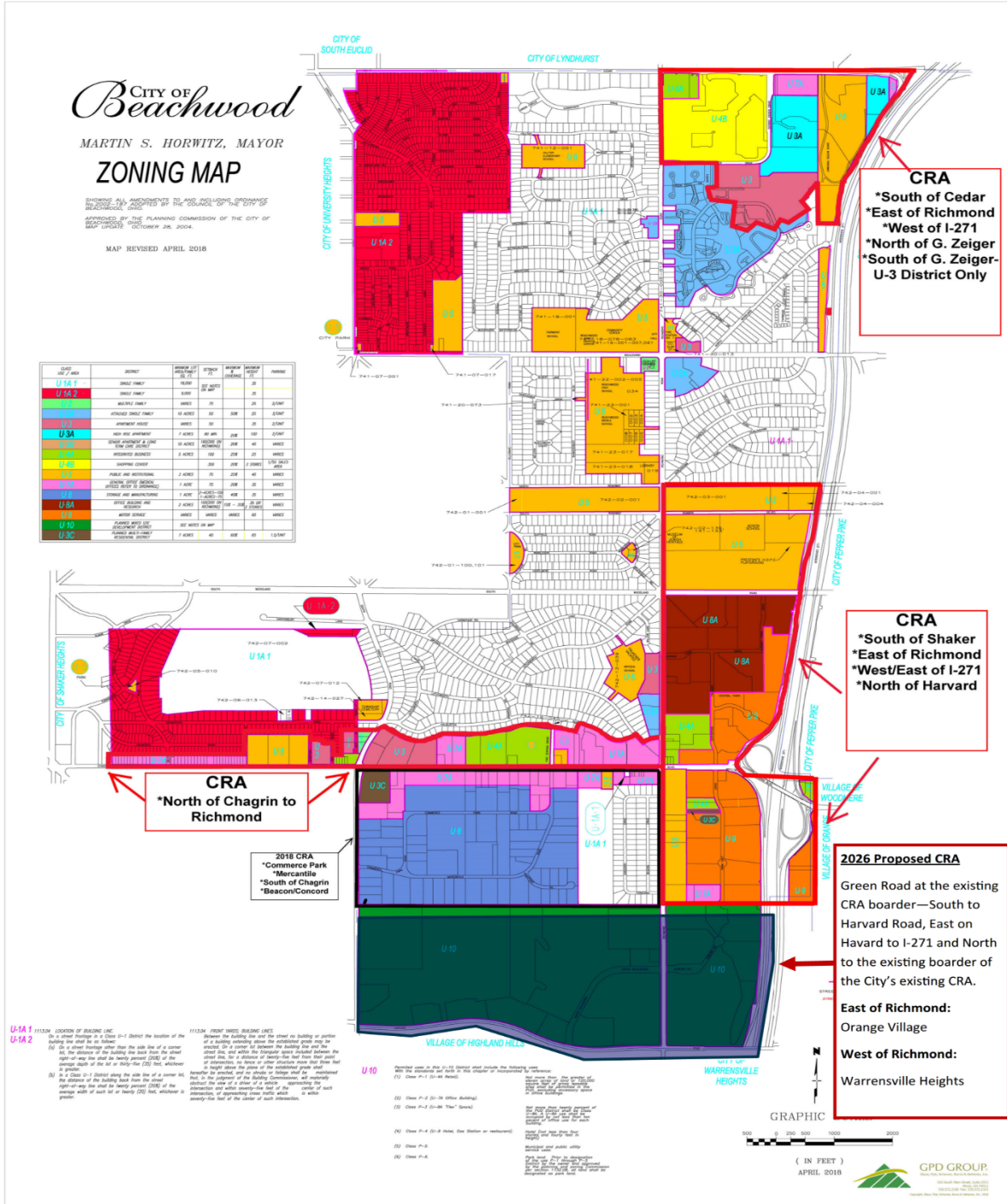

This request is for approval of a dog day care facility as a similar use in the U-4A Integrated Business District. The applicants are seeking to establish a combination of a dog day care facility along with a restaurant and bar. The subject site is the former fire station and truck park site located at the intersection of Fire Station Drive and Chagrin Boulevard. The restaurant and bar portion of the proposed operation is permitted in the U-4A District; however, the dog care facility is not a listed permitted use in that District. Currently the only place where pet care facilities are permitted is in the U-8 District. It should be noted that pet stores are a permitted use in the U-4A District, and historically those facilities have included such ancillary activities as dog grooming.

The applicants have not finalized plans pending approval of the use, but will submit final site plans and building layouts if the use is approved. They are proposing up to 100 indoor seats and 50 outdoor seats for the restaurant/bar operation. Those numbers are somewhat less than what was approved for the truck park facility. At the time the truck park operation was approved, the site had shared parking and access agreements with the adjacent parcels in order to meet parking requirements. The owners of the adjacent parcels have indicated that those cross parking and access agreements remain in place for the proposed use. The slightly lower seating capacity for the restaurant / bar should provide enough parking coverage for the dog day care operation.

The dog day care would operate Monday thru Friday from 6 am until 5 pm. Evenings and weekends they would operate a dog park until about 9 pm. Based on staffing and play areas, the applicants are proposing a maximum of about 45 dogs

for day care. During the dog park hours, the maximum number of dogs on site at any given time will not exceed 75. The site plan indicates both indoor and outdoor exercise/play areas for the dogs. The preliminary plan indicated an outdoor play area of just over 3,100 square feet and an indoor exercise / play area of about 1,800 square feet. The exact size of those exercise / play areas will be established as part of the final site development plan approval.

Similar use determinations require the concurrence of City Council, so the Commission will need to act in the form of a recommendation to Council. All similar uses are treated as conditional uses and subject to such stipulations and conditions as the Commission and Council deem appropriate.

Should the Commission determine to recommend approval of the dog day care facility, the following stipulations are recommended:

1. The maximum number of dogs permitted on the subject site at any given time shall be 75.
2. The applicants shall provide arrangements for the control and removal of animal wastes in a manner approved by the Administration.
3. Outdoor exercise / play areas shall be fenced with a solid fence a minimum of six (6) feet in height. The final design, type, and location of the fencing shall be as shown on the final site development plan.
4. There shall be no overnight boarding of dogs.
5. Dog washing and grooming is permitted provided such facilities meet health and Building Code requirements.
6. Seating capacity for the restaurant / bar operation shall be limited to a maximum of 100 indoor seats and 50 outdoor seats.
7. Hours of operation shall be from 6 am until 9 pm unless modified by the Commission.
8. The applicants shall submit a final site development plan for approval by the Commission.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION'S DETERMINATION THAT A DOG DAYCARE FACILITY AT 24619 CHAGRIN BOULEVARD IS A SIMILAR, HARMONIOUS, AND COMPATIBLE USE TO THE LISTED PERMITTED USES WITHIN THE U-4A INTEGRATED BUSINESS DISTRICT; AND DECLARING THIS TO BE AN URGENT MEASURE

WHEREAS, Section 1159.01 of the Codified Ordinances authorizes the Planning and Zoning Commission, with the consent and approval of City Council, to make a determination that a requested use not expressly listed as a permitted use within a particular use district is a similar, harmonious, and compatible use within said district where the approval of said use will not adversely affect other properties and is consistent with the spirit and intent of both the use district and the Zoning Code;

WHEREAS, Section 1159.01 further provides that when the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council find a use to be similar, harmonious, and compatible to the listed permitted uses in a district, such use shall be treated as a permitted use within the identified use district;

WHEREAS, Section 1159.01 also provides that such determination shall be considered an interpretation of the Zoning Code and not a use variance;

WHEREAS, Grant Passell and Evan Pascorella, on behalf of Brad Kowit Real Estate, requested that the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council find that a dog daycare facility located at 24619 Chagrin Boulevard is a similar, harmonious, and compatible use to the listed permitted uses within the U-4A Integrated Business District;

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission, on March 26, 2026, reviewed the request and recommended that City Council approve the requested use as being similar, harmonious, and compatible with the U-4A District permitted uses, subject to certain conditions, stipulations, and requirements; and

WHEREAS, in making such recommendation, the Planning and Zoning Commission found that the proposed use will not adversely affect other properties, is consistent with the spirit and intent of the use district and the Zoning Code, and that the effect of the use, including hours of operation and traffic generated, is similar in effect to surrounding uses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Beachwood, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: This Council, in accordance with Section 1159.01 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Beachwood, Ohio, and subject to compliance with the conditions, stipulations, and requirements set forth herein, hereby consents to and approves the Planning and Zoning Commission's determination that a dog daycare facility located at 24619 Chagrin Boulevard is a similar, harmonious, and compatible use to the listed permitted uses within the U-4A Integrated Business District, and further finds that such use will not adversely affect other properties, is consistent with the spirit and intent of the use district and the Zoning Code, and that the effect of the use, including hours of operation and traffic generated, is similar in effect to surrounding uses.

Section 2: The approval and findings in Section 1 of this Ordinance are conditioned upon the applicant's compliance with the following:

1. The maximum number of dogs permitted on the subject site at any given time shall be determined at a later date.
2. The operator shall provide arrangements for the control and removal of animal waste in a manner approved by the City Administration.
3. Outdoor exercise and play areas shall be enclosed with a solid fence a minimum of six (6) feet in height, with final design, type, and location subject to approval as part of the final site development plan.
4. No overnight boarding of dogs shall be permitted.
5. Dog washing and grooming facilities may be permitted, provided such facilities comply with all applicable health and Building Code requirements.
6. Seating capacity for the associated restaurant and bar operation shall be limited to a maximum of one hundred (100) indoor seats and fifty (50) outdoor seats.
7. Hours of operation shall be limited to 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., unless otherwise modified by the Planning and Zoning Commission.
8. A final site development plan shall be submitted for review and approval by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Section 3: The Building Commissioner is directed to include the conditions, stipulations, and requirements listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance in any certificate of occupancy issued for the subject property. Failure to comply with any such conditions or any other provision of the Zoning Code shall constitute a violation and may be enforced accordingly.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions and deliberations of Council and its committees relating to the passage of this legislation that resulted in formal action were in meetings open to the public where required by Chapter 105 of the Codified Ordinances of the City.

Section 4: This Resolution is declared to be an urgent measure necessary for the public peace, health, safety, or the efficient operation of the City; and for the further reason of the immediate necessity of approving, and confirming the Planning and Zoning Commission's determination in order to facilitate timely development and use of the property; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

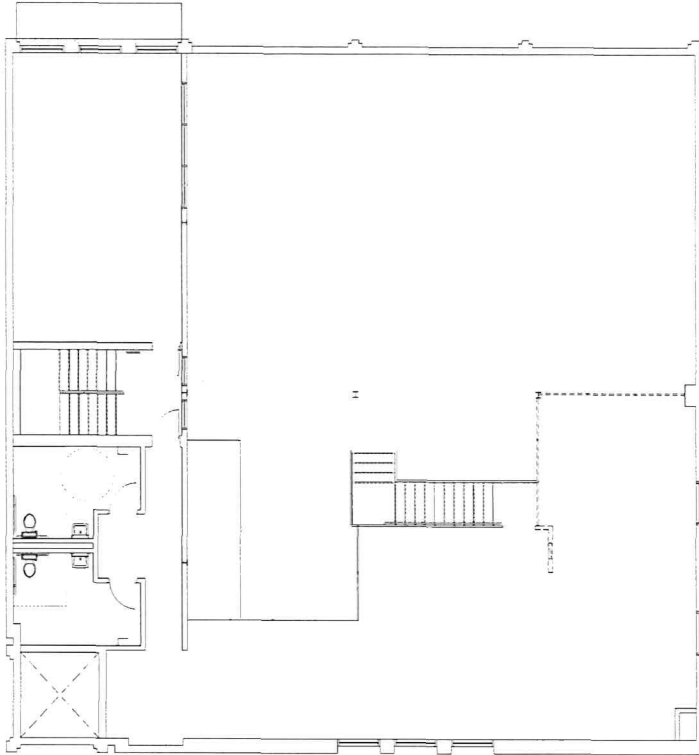

Eaton Boulevard Reconstruction | BEACHWOOD, OH

The project involved the construction of a four-lane concrete pavement road, with a center landscaped median from the current terminus at Richmond Road to Harvard Road. This project was necessary to provide access for the new world headquarters of Eaton Corporation. The scope of work consisted of clearing and grubbing, grading, compaction, cement subbase stabilization, concrete pavement, and concrete curb. Richmond Road Reconstruction | BEACHWOOD, OH

Richmond Road Widening (South Woodland to Shaker Boulevard)

This project involved the widening of Richmond Road from four to five lanes. All widening was completed on the east side of the road. The Maltz Museum drive apron was removed and replaced, and the apron was widened to accommodate future widened ingress/egress driveway and widened the southeast corner of Richmond Road and Shaker Boulevard.

Richmond Road/South Woodland Road Intersection

The project consisted of the removal and replacement (in phases) of the entire concrete pavement on South Woodland, Letchworth, and Brucefield Roads. The South Woodland approach pavement was widened for an additional right turn lane from South Woodland westbound to Richmond Road northbound, installed one new traffic signal strain pole to accommodate the roadway widening on the northeast corner of this intersection, and removed and replaced all sidewalk curb ramps to meet current ADA Standards.

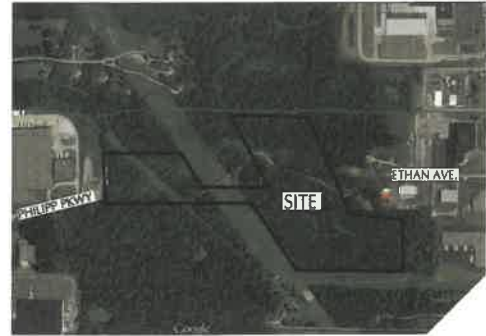
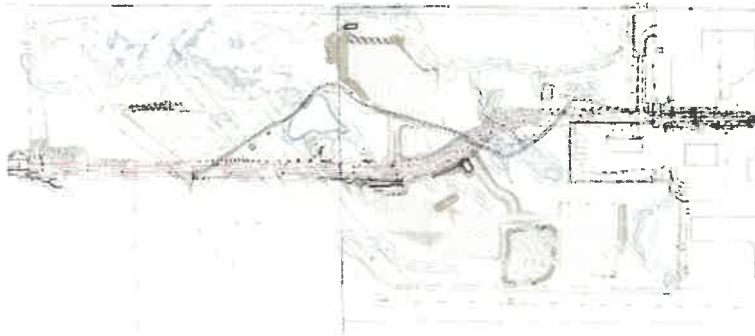
Richmond Road/Shaker Boulevard to Hendon Road

The project consisted of the removal and replacement (in 2 phases) of the entire concrete pavement, removal and replacement of concrete curbs and underdrains, removal and replacement of 1/2 of every drive apron, cement stabilize the subbase, pavement striping to replace all existing pavement markings, and replacement of concrete curb ramps to meet ADA Standards.

Richmond Road/Hendon Road to Fairmount Boulevard

The project consisted of the removal and replacement of the concrete pavement, removal and replacement of concrete curbs and underdrains, removal and replacement of drive aprons, cement stabilize the subbase, pavement striping to replace all existing pavement markings, and replacement of concrete curb ramps to meet ADA Standards. This project also replaced the Fairmount Boulevard/Richmond Road intersection with new concrete pavement. Two signal poles were also replaced.

Philipp Parkway Extension | STREETSBORO, OH

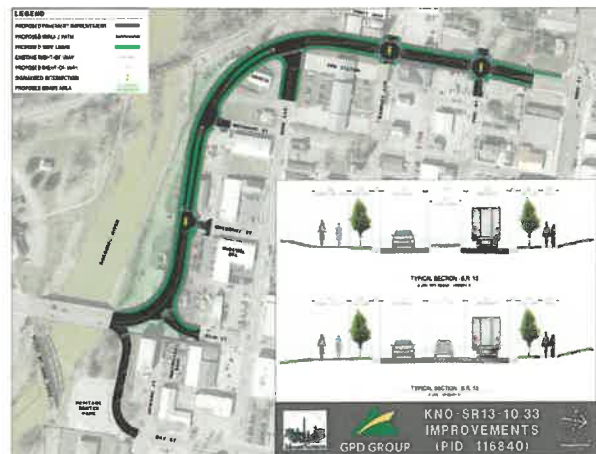


This public/private project collaboration involved the extension of a public roadway to serve as an important economic benefit for commercial/industrial development and traffic circulation. The land had remained undeveloped for years because of challenging terrain and a significant presence of aquatic features. GPD was able to make the project economically feasible with creative master planning efforts to avoid wetland impacts and minimize earthwork costs. Design and permitting were completed within an expedited schedule. Stream and wetland impacts were mitigated by Section 404/401 Nationwide Permit. The completed project achieved the roadway connection sought by the City and expanded economic development potential.

KNO-SR13-10.33 Roadway Reconstruction | MOUNT VERNON, OH

This project was developed from a GPD-prepared 2018 Downtown Traffic Study that investigated the traffic network in downtown Mount Vernon, with an emphasis on truck traffic. Mount Vernon has numerous State and US Routes that exist downtown and through their public square. The goal of the study was to determine improvements that would enhance the overall operation of the roadway network, maintain and encourage access to the Main Street/downtown area, and minimize truck traffic through the historic public square.

The traffic study identified numerous improvement recommendations, including re-routing US 36, SR 3, SR 13, and SR 229. Most of the proposed re-routing can be accomplished using existing roadways in the downtown area. The SR 13 rerouting requires more significant improvements. The SR 13 re-routing includes the creation of a new three-lane roadway on a new alignment from S. Main Street to Ohio Avenue to replace Phillips Drive and the reconstruction and widening of S. Sandusky Street from Ohio Avenue to High Street. Improvements include new curb and gutter, sidewalk, shared-use path, two traffic signal replacements, one new traffic signal, water line, sanitary sewer, and drainage improvements. Several building takes are required to accommodate the new roadway. The project also included funding assistance, geotechnical services, and a public involvement meeting.



MAH-MRCO New Roadway and Bridge | STRUTHERS, OH

GPD completed the construction of a 262-foot-long, two-span steel plate girder bridge on pile-supported stub abutments and a drilled shaft-supported cap-and-column pier. The entire project consists of a 682-foot-long extension of Bob Cene Way on a new alignment, which starts in the City of Struthers, extends with a new structure over the Mahoning River, and then connects to an existing industrial road in the City of Campbell.

The new extended roadway and bridge carries two lanes of traffic. The project included environmental hazardous waste screening of the riverbed, preparation of Phase I and II Environmental Site Assessments, a structure type study with various bridge alternatives, drainage and stormwater management, and a geotechnical investigation.



Ferry Drive Reconstruction | ASHTABULA, OH



The existing roadway section of Ferry Drive, located north of E. 6th Street, had degraded. The existing concrete pavement had become unstable and visually unappealing, making the area less attractive for potential business development. The City saw a need to rebuild the access road to improve safety, support future growth, and protect nearby waterways from stormwater runoff. GPD designed the total reconstruction of a 0.13-mile section of Ferry Drive. The reconstruction involved completely removing the existing concrete pavement and constructing a new asphalt roadway, along with new curbs, drainage improvements, and traffic signs. The design also incorporated water quality features to help prevent contaminants from reaching the Ashtabula River and Lake Erie. This project brings long-term value to the community by improving infrastructure, enhancing safety, and making the area more appealing for economic development. It also helps protect local water resources and supports the City's broader revitalization efforts.

MED-94-3.80 Corridor Improvements | WADSWORTH, OH

To address congestion in Wadsworth's commercial core, GPD conducted independent safety and traffic operations studies of the I-76/SR 94 interchange and a 1.7-mile arterial corridor. These identified key safety and congestion issues, which GPD tackled by widening SR 94 (High Street) to add dual left-turn lanes at major intersections, turn lanes at minor ones, and implementing access management strategies, including frontage roads, for over 40 businesses to provide safe access to businesses while removing conflicting movements from the roadway network. A traffic-responsive signal system with emergency preemption was installed to interconnect eight signals and improve corridor flow.

The \$12M ODOT-let project included a dual-use path, sidewalks, decorative medians, cross-access drives, stormwater detention systems, intersection lighting, and full traffic control upgrades. A robust public involvement plan, including three public meetings, fostered collaboration among business owners, the City, ODOT, and GPD. GPD also secured \$10M in safety funds and supported additional funding from NOACA.

4. Capacity of Staff/Availability to Perform the Work in a Timely Manner

GPD's QA/QC Program and Project Specific Plan for Quality Assurance

Delivering quality is a vital component of GPD's project delivery plan. At GPD, we believe that the Project Manager (Matt Glass for this project) is responsible for all aspects of the project. The PM will coordinate with all needed internal disciplines and subconsultants to confirm that one cohesive product is delivered to the client. But, we do not depend upon the PM alone to certify quality, as such, we have developed a rigorous QA/QC program to verify that all projects which are designed and delivered by GPD meet the industry standard of care. The program begins the day a project is awarded, and a schedule is set. Reviews are completed for each discipline by the Chief Engineer in that area. In this way, GPD can be confident that all aspects of the project have been reviewed at each project stage. Completion of this QC process is required in order for the final plans to be signed and sealed.



5. Project Approach

Our team will deliver a fully coordinated roadway, utility, intersection, and environmental design package for the new three-lane connector road between Harvard Road and Mercantile/Commerce Park. The design includes intersection improvements, a wetlands culvert crossing, and a regional stormwater facility. The City has confirmed that ODOT will not be the lead reviewing agency, and that Beachwood and Highland Hills standards will govern reviews. City RFI responses confirm:

1. The topographic survey will be provided in AutoCAD format.
2. Army Corps correspondence, including a July 25, 2011, letter documenting that mitigation wetlands have developed into stable, diverse aquatic systems requiring no further monitoring, will be furnished.
3. Municipal entities will conduct design reviews.

1. Technical Approach

Phase 1: Preliminary Engineering & Data Collection (Months 1-3)

Survey and Base Mapping—We will integrate the City’s AutoCAD topographic survey and supplement it with targeted surveys at 23456 Mercantile Road and the Harvard Road intersection. The City-confirmed availability of a design-usable survey avoids duplicate field work and accelerates project initiation.

Traffic and Signals—A Synchro/SimTraffic warrant analysis will evaluate Harvard Road signal needs and account for future Chagrin Highlands development traffic. A brief traffic study will be performed to determine the needed turn lane lengths on Harvard Road and Mercantile Road, as well as document the signal warrant. This will be based on a combination of existing traffic on Harvard and Mercantile, combined with estimated future traffic on the new Connector Road. The new signal on Harvard will be designed to current City standards, including decorative signal stanchions, and will be integrated into the existing citywide signal system to optimize traffic flow.

Geotechnical—Subsurface exploration and laboratory testing will guide pavement design for the connector, Harvard widening, and Mercantile Road improvements.

Environmental—USACE PJD Integration. Environmental work will follow the USACE Preliminary Jurisdictional Determination (PJD) LRB-2021-01146, which identifies multiple wetlands (A–E) and streams (1–5) to be treated as jurisdictional. The PJD was validated by a Corps field review and directs that all aquatic resources be considered jurisdictional under Section 404. Additionally, the City will provide the Army Corps correspondence dated July 25, 2011, confirming that mitigation wetlands on the site have matured into “stable, diverse, aquatic systems” requiring no further monitoring. This allows our field efforts to focus on verification-level checks rather than full re-delineation, reducing environmental scope and permitting risk.

Utilities—We will coordinate water, sanitary, storm, electric, gas, fiber, and telecommunications extensions from Harvard and Mercantile Roads into the new corridor to support long-term development.

Phase 2: Roadway, Intersection, Drainage & Utility Design (Months 4–8)

Geometry and Complete Streets—We will develop full corridor geometry with curbs, sidewalks, LED lighting, and street trees. Harvard Road will be widened to add left-turn lanes; Mercantile Road will be widened for a westbound left-turn lane.

Culvert and Conservation Easement—The wetlands culvert near Harvard will be designed using HEC-RAS and aligned to avoid or minimize impacts to delineated wetlands and streams. The 2011 Corps letter confirming successful wetland mitigation reduces permit uncertainty by affirming long-term ecological stability. Coordination with WRLC will occur at the 60% milestone.

Regional Stormwater Facility—A regional stormwater facility at the site’s low point will be designed according to ODOT L&D Vol. 2 and will serve both roadway drainage and future development parcels.

Model-Based Delivery and Earthwork—Civil 3D modeling will coordinate roadway, drainage, utilities, and grading. Earthwork will be balanced to create development-ready building pads and reduce hauling costs.

Maintenance of Traffic—GPD will develop a comprehensive Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) Plan package

that includes clear, project-specific notes and detailed illustrations outlining the proposed traffic management strategies. Because the majority of the project will be constructed offline, minimal impact to existing traffic is anticipated. Due to the limited roadway width along Mercantile Road, the recommended approach is to construct the roadway improvements using a directional detour, with traffic temporarily routed to Commerce Park Road. Curb lane closures along Harvard Road will be implemented in accordance with the ODOT Standard Construction Drawing MT-95.31. Pedestrian detours will also be established as needed to maintain safe, accessible pathways around active construction zones. Additionally, the MOT plans will provide explicit guidance to ensure that all traffic restrictions and construction schedules are coordinated with local emergency services and the Beachwood City School District.

Phase 3: Final Design, Permitting, & Bid Documents (Months 9-12)

Permitting Path—We will prepare the Section 404 permitting package using PJD LRB-2021-01146 and the 2011 correspondence verifying stable mitigation. We will verify the applicability of Nationwide versus Individual Permit pathways and integrate all permit conditions into construction documents.

PS&E, QA/QC, and Reviews—With Beachwood and Highland Hills as reviewing authorities, submittal cycles will be streamlined. We will conduct QA/QC at 30/60/90%, incorporate constructability reviews, and host a secure cloud portal for progress tracking.

2. Understanding of the Project

The connector road will unlock access to the City's 43-acre Chagrin Highlands property via a three-lane roadway, intersection improvements, utility extensions, a wetlands crossing, and a regional stormwater facility. The corridor lies within a 4.8724-acre access easement, and the Harvard Road intersection requires coordination with Highland Hills. City responses confirm survey availability, Army Corps documentation (including the 2011 stability letter), and municipal review responsibility.

3. Qualifications for Project

The GPD team has served as an extension of the City's staff for over 20 years, completing numerous projects of similar size and scope for both the City of Beachwood and surrounding municipalities. We will continue professionally conducting the required work and assisting the organization in every way possible. That is why we believe that GPD is well-prepared for this project.

4. Knowledge of ODOT and Local Standards

The GPD team has vast knowledge of the City of Beachwood, and we have completed numerous ODOT LPA projects within projects in District 12, so we are well-versed in ODOT criteria and standards. By bringing our experience, relationships, and qualifications, the City can expect a smoothly delivered project.

Attached is price quote through SAVVIK co-op for the Bryx station alerting system. Our current zetron alerting system was upgraded from an analog system to an IP address system in 2018 which allowed the system to continue to function. Our current system is no longer being supported and the upgrade for the new zetron system is very costly and doesn't perform all of the functions that we are currently looking for. The Bryx system will meet these department needs and improve dispatch times. With our crews working 24 hours shifts it will allow each apparatus to be zoned individually, which will allow only the crews that are to respond to be notified. In addition this system will auto dispatch the call while the dispatchers are on the phone with the caller and allow for faster notification which will let the dispatcher to continue to give life-saving instructions that may need to articulated to the caller. A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING A QUOTATION FROM BRYX INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF A BRYX FIRE STATION ALERTING SYSTEM FOR THE CITY OF BEACHWOOD, WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING; AND DECLARING THIS TO BE AN URGENT MEASURE

WHEREAS, the City has identified the need to upgrade and/or replace its fire station alerting system in order to enhance emergency response efficiency, reliability, and firefighter safety; and

WHEREAS, the City's current Zetron fire station alerting system was upgraded in 2018 from an analog system to an IP-based system, allowing it to continue functioning; and

WHEREAS, the current system is no longer supported, and the cost to upgrade to a new Zetron system is significant and would not provide all of the functionality desired by the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, the BRYX Fire Station Alerting System will meet the operational needs of the Fire Department by improving dispatch times, allowing apparatus-specific zoning so that only the appropriate crews are notified during 24-hour shifts, and enabling automatic dispatching of calls while dispatchers remain on the line to provide life-saving instructions; and

WHEREAS, BCO Chapter 121.09(d)(1) authorizes the City to purchase equipment, materials, supplies and other articles that have been competitively bid in accordance with participating cooperative purchasing programs; and

WHEREAS, the City has obtained pricing for the BRYX Fire Station Alerting System through the SAVVIK cooperative purchasing program in the amount of One Hundred Thirty-Three Thousand Fifty-Five Dollars and No/Cents (\$133,055.00); and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that such purchase is in the best interest of the City and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Beachwood, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: Based upon the quotation received from Bryx, Inc., the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement for the purchase and installation of a BRYX Fire Station Alerting System through the SAVVIK cooperative purchasing program, in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thirty-Three Thousand Fifty-Five Dollars (\$133,055.00). Council hereby determines that the use of the SAVVIK cooperative purchasing program constitutes a competitive procurement process and waives competitive bidding requirements based upon the recitals set forth herein. A copy of the quotation is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as **Exhibit "A"**.

Section 2: It is found and determined that all formal actions and deliberations of Council and its committees relating to the passage of this legislation that resulted in formal action were in meetings open to the public where required by Chapter 105 of the Codified Ordinances of the City.
